Editor Notes: Tighten Up

I write a short story. It has the word count I'm looking for and I think it sounds pretty good. My friends like it. But then I spend weeks, sometimes months, revisiting it over and over to tighten nearly every sentence. It's like I never get my prose tight enough.

What I cut the most were articles, contractions, redundancies, prepositional phrases, unnecessary modifiers... Today I cut a whole paragraph. It nearly broke my heart to kill that darling, but I had to admit: although it flowed well and was grammatically correct, it served no useful purpose. Tightening our sentences even after we think the story is done is a good thing: the editor/agent will like it more and, in the end, the story will give the audience a better reading experience. I definitely believe it is worth the time and effort to tighten and then tighten again, even though we may have to excise some darlings in the process. :-)
