They have published the winning stories for the past 23 years of the contest and we can read them for free by clicking on the links at the bottom of the contest webpage. So if you have an interest in short stories that contain 2500 words or less, check out this site. My announcement may reach you too late to enter the contest this year, but at least you can read the stories the *Austin Chronicle* selected as winners in previous years.

Writing Contests

- ▶ Neoverse Short Story Writing Competition: Deadline: December 20. 1st prize \$2,000. 2nd prize \$600. 3rd prize \$200. 4th-10th prizes \$100. Entries should be between 1,000 and 5,000 words. They can be from any literary genre (History, Fantasy, Young Adult, Crime, Science Fiction, etc), but entries must be appropriate for reading and viewing by the general public. - ▶ Gover Story Prize: Deadline: December 31, 2015. NO ENTRY FEE. Best New Writing accepts unpublished fiction and creative nonfiction under 10,000 words for publication and consideration for the Gover Story Prize (\$250). The story must be new and unpublished, including online publication. - ▶ W. B. Yeats Poetry Competition: Deadline: February 1, 2016. Entry fee: \$10. First prize \$500, second \$250, honorable mentions. Unpublished poems in English up to 60 lines on any subject.
